It is our great pleasure to invite you to the international malting and brewing symposium “**11th Trends in Brewing**” (TIB), which is jointly organised by KAHO Sint-Lieven (KU Leuven) (Ghent, Belgium), Heriot-Watt University (Edinburgh, Scotland), and Technical University Berlin (Berlin, Germany). The 11th TIB will take place from 13-17 April 2014 at the Technology Campus KAHO Sint-Lieven, situated near the renowned historical centre of Ghent city.

Current beer production is faced with great challenges since it should be ecologically justifiable and remain payable, whereas at the same time sensible consumers expect a growing diversity of authentic beers of superior quality. “**Can Trends in Brewing be revolutionary?**” was therefore selected as the central theme of the symposium. During the 11th TIB, we will not only make a careful examination of the state of the art of malting and brewing practice but equally well evaluate potential technology transfer opportunities from other industries, which represents largely unexplored territory. Thus, we will deal with highly pertinent questions, such as: “What can we learn from other industries regarding cost-efficient, sustainable production and optimized process design?” and “Which technologies might be taken into consideration for implementation during extract production, fermentation, and beer finishing/packaging?”. Important issues like cost-reduction whilst maintaining quality, reduced water consumption, energy savings, continuous beer production, and adequate logistics in export will be raised. Each session will comprise a key lecture given by a prominent invited speaker, followed by oral presentations on more specific, practical matters. Moreover, the latest findings and technologies will be presented through peer-reviewed posters and an extensive technical exhibition. The symposium will also allow to visit local industrial maltings and breweries, and to discover the richness of Belgian beer culture by tasting its excellent specialty beers.

Being convinced that the “**11th Trends in Brewing**” will be a great opportunity to exchange knowledge and new ideas in a pleasant atmosphere, we look forward to meeting you.
